




Language assessment before departure + upon return:

- ✓ Evaluate participants' proficiency in the language they will use to study or work
- ✗ **Not a barrier to mobility!**
- ✓ To make the **most out of their experience**
- ✗ **No official diploma or certificate**

Online language course:

- ✓ before and during the stay abroad
- ✓ to **improve language competences**
- ✗ OLS courses: **not considered ECTS credit**
- ✗ do not count towards **official diplomas**
- ✓ OLS language courses cover all skills of language learning tested in FCE, TOEFL, Goethe, DALF, etc.

Commitment from sending HEIs to ensure that outgoing students have the requested language level.




OLS language assessment **NOT** meant to compete with international language certifications, but to help identify the students most in need of linguistic support and measure their progress.

Adaptation to VET context



Adaptation of the OLS for VET learners

In place:








Significant improvements of mobility participants' language skills

- ✓ Participants' progress depends on the **initial level**, **selected language**, the use of and assiduity in the **language course**
- ✓ The average improvement is higher for participants whose initial level is **low (A1-B1)** than for participants with high initial level (C1-C2)
- ✓ Intensive use of the language course and longer mobility duration further increase the participants' progress
- ✓ Other possible factors: linguistic distance between mother tongue and mobility language, motivation and effort put into LA2



Improvement for the Call 2016:

- Earlier OLS licence allocation to BEN projects
- Smoother management of licences

As from the 2016 Call, the n. of OLS licences indicated in **grant agreements** will not require amendments in case of increase or decrease due to a new provision under Article I.XX. A simple notification will be sufficient.

VET applications 2016: New languages in 2016

Six new languages will become available in the OLS in 2016:

Czech, Swedish, Danish, Greek, Polish and Portuguese

Online linguistic support in these languages will be available for participants in KA102, KA116 and KA105 projects under all Calls (i.e. 2014, 2015, 2016 and following Calls).

I. OLS language assessments

All VET learners with one of the 12 OLS languages as their main mobility language must take the OLS language assessment prior and after their mobility.

II. OLS language courses

OLS language courses in the six new languages are not available at all levels.

Languages	Language assessment available	Language course available

Portuguese	Yes	Yes – up until B2 level

Because the level of the participant is not known at application stage, beneficiary organisations who wish to provide linguistic support in these new six languages should **request a grant for linguistic preparation (€150)**.

Based on the assessment results, some participants may wish to follow an OLS language course instead of making use of the grant.

Please note that due to this change, your language course licences may have decreased in number.

Mobility participants who have obtained a result between CEFR levels B2 and C2 at their first language assessment are NOT automatically allocated a language course licence. You may invite them to follow a language course in the OLS Licence Management System. The language course can be in their main language of instruction/work, OR in the local language of the country, provided that such language is available in the OLS. In the 3rd tab (Licence Allocation to Participants – Course) you will only see participants who have obtained a result between CEFR levels B2 and C2 at their first language assessment. And you will be able to manually select the language of the courses for these participants.


